



While in film school, DeVonna has worked on 23 short films in her three years at Rutgers, including her most recent, Tristan, where she featured an allblack cast and crew. She has also created multiple films about Sickle Cell Disease, her chronic blood disorder that caused frequent hospitalizations. Her goal is to raise awareness and empowerment for this illness, which she is extremely passionate about because it affects people of African descent. DeVonna is proud of all she has accomplished while managing her Sickle Cell Disease, and especially, maintaining Dean's List status every semester. After graduating, she plans to explore multiple artistic avenues and work to create space for minority groups while pursuing a career in the New York film industry.
